WHO SHOULD ATTEND

This course is designed for:

- Practicing physicians in both primary care and other specialty fields, seeking an introduction to the full spectrum of substance use disorders, their diagnosis, and appropriate management;
- Physicians preparing for the certification examination in addiction medicine requiring an overview of the core elements of addiction medicine in a way that allows them to identify the areas where they may need more study;

PREPARING FOR THE ASAM CERTIFICATION EXAM

The Review Course presents an overview of the core elements of addiction medicine, presented by top experts in the field. Participants receive a course syllabus with copies of all lecture handouts and other materials that can serve as a study guide and help prepare for the exam. We recommend that those taking the exam begin their study of *Principles of Addiction Medicine, III ed.* well before the exam. To order your copy, call ASAM Publications at 800/844-8948.

For those who wish to have additional focused exam preparation, we are offering a **Special Certification Exam Preparation Track**. During the conference plenary, participants in the certification track will sit at a table with other exam takers and a facilitator who will help identify the key material for the exam and answer questions. In all, this option provides 7 hours devoted to test taking strategies, sample questions, exam content, and tips on how to prepare for the exam. Participants in the exam preparation track will receive an additional CD-ROM with study materials and resources that will complement the Review Course material. CSAM will facilitate post conference exam preparations through a moderated email discussion group.

CREDIT

Physicians: The California Society of Addiction Medicine (CSAM) is accredited by the Institute for Medical Quality/California Medical Association (IMQ/CMA) to provide continuing medical education for physicians. C **CURRENT CONTROVERSIES IN ADDICTION MEDICINE**
An on-going controversy in addiction medicine concerns the role and effectiveness of abstinence-based programs vs. narcotic replacement treatment. This translates into whether patients on methadone or buprenorphine should be allowed into treatment groups. Two expert physicians, each on opposite sides of the debate, will express their "point-counterpoint" viewpoints on this topic and others in our field. A debate instructor will facilitate to help participants distinguish between logical arguments and fallacies. Other controversies to be addressed include the role of pharmaceutical company support: is pharmaceutical support of CME an insidious corrupting influence or wrongly maligned benefit? In addition to gaining a better understanding of controversial issues, participants will learn how to analyze evidence, argumentation, and ethical issues.

F **MEDICAL MANAGEMENT OF PATIENTS ON METHADONE: THE CURRENT STANDARD OF CARE**
Based on the CSAM "Guidelines for Physicians Working in California OTPs," this course is designed for medical personnel in methadone treatment programs and for physicians interested in the specifics of methadone maintenance treatment (MMT).
